History Center Logo

The History Center logo represents a wax seal. Wax seals were used in the past to seal letters closed. Wax would have been melted over a letter after it is folded. A special stamp with an image that represents your family, government, or business was then pushed into the wax, leaving a design. This seal also helped show that letter has not been opened. Today, we have envelopes that have sticky glue that help hold a letter closed.

Another reason this design was selected for the History Center logo is that our building is located in Sycamore (the county seat). A county seal was often used at the

courthouse to show official business.
